



If your child attends am or pm it would be £4.00 per month. Full time is £6. This is a voluntary fund, it is used to purchase Birthday/Christmas/ gifts/baking ingredients/ malleable/outings/parties etc.

### **Important Information**

#### Clothing

Your child will be very busy during nursery. Taking part in lots of experiences both indoors and out. Clothing should be suitable for the weather to allow children to take part in all experiences offered. Children should not wear their best clothes as there may be a risk that they could be damaged. If possible, try to stay away from difficult fastenings i.e. buckles, belts etc as the child may have difficulty going to the toilet. Parents should provide 1 change of clothes and wellington boots. A sun hat. Nappies and wipes if your child requires them.

During warmer weather all children should have sunscreen applied before coming to nursery.

#### Attendance

If your child is going to be absent, please inform the nursery. If you are going on holiday, please inform me of the dates.

#### Medication

If your child requires medication during their time at nursery this should be discussed with a member of management. All medications must be prescribed by the child's doctor and must have the child's name, date of birth and dose attached to the medication. The first dose of any new medication must be administered by the parent. You will be required to fill in a consent form detailing information about the medicine. Please do not leave any medicines in



### **Policies**

#### **Admissions Policy**

#### Settling in

When your child is due to start nursery there will be a settling in period. Your child's key worker will work in partnership with you to ensure the transition from home to nursery runs as smoothly as possible. Each child is different and there is no set time limit for settling in. Some children take longer than others.

#### Arrival and collection of children

When your child starts nursery, you will be asked to complete a collection form detailing who will be dropping off and picking up your child. Please note the person collecting must be 16 or over. Due to child protection reasons staff will only allow children to leave with people identified on this list. If in any circumstances the parent requires someone else to collect their child, they must phone or speak to a member of management.

#### Additional support for learning

Every child has the right to education to support them to enjoy a full life and achieve the greatest degree of self-reliance and social integration as possible.



#### Accidents

If a child has a minor accident this will be treated accordingly. It will be recorded in the Accident book. Parent will be informed and asked to sign the accident book.

Linda Smith is the qualified first aider.


#### Glasgow City Council Child Protection Policy

'The child protection programme seeks to support the child's development in ways which will foster security, confidence and independence. It should be regarded as central to the well-being of the individual and is therefore seen to be an intrinsic part of all aspects of the curriculum'. Staff have a responsibility to:

\* Keep children safe by being proactive in child protection matters \* Promote the welfare of children by maintaining a positive and supportive ethos \* Help children protect themselves by providing an appropriate personal and social development curriculum \* Be familiar with child protection procedures and guidance and implement those procedures promptly when there is a suspicion of child abuse \* Work closely with other agencies and services in supporting children \* Actively participate in training on child protection matters Caroline Dunleavy is the nursery child protection co-ordinator.

#### Confidentiality

All staff adhere to Glasgow City Council's confidentiality policy. Parents and children must feel confident that information they choose to share with a member of staff will be treated with respect and handled appropriately.




#### Promoting positive behaviour

All children have the right to a calm secure, supportive and purposeful environment, which allows them the opportunity to develop respect for themselves and for others. Strategies for promoting positive behaviour are based on a philosophy of negotiation and reconciliation, we endeavour to use restorative, solution oriented and nurturing approaches.

We turn off the taps and we switch of the lights,


Let's keep our planet shiny and bright.
